• Civilians, IS fighters killed in west Mosul mosque strike, residents say

A number of civilians and Islamic State members were killed in an attack that hit a mosque run by the militants and damaged neighboring houses in the west of the Iraqi city of Mosul on Wednesday, three residents said on Thursday. The Omar al-Aswad mosque, in the al-Faruq district of the old city center, was hit by an airstrike, three residents in the same area told Reuters by phone.

• Civilian death toll grows amid ISIS attempts to disrupt Mosul siege, UN figures show

The Mosul region has suffered the highest number of civilian casualties among Iraq's provinces in February, according to new UN estimates, as the US-backed coalition tightens its grip on densely populated western neighborhoods of the ISIS-held city. A total of 329 civilians were killed and 613 injured across Iraq in February, in "acts of terrorism, violence, and armed conflict," according to new figures by UN Assistance Mission for Iraq (UNAMI). The Iraqi military operation to retake Mosul from Islamic State [IS, formerly ISIS/ISIL] and its desperate attempts to hold ground apparently caused a serious surge in civilian casualties.

• New Trump immigration order won't have blanket ban on Iraq, sources say

The newly revised order, made to replace a prior order that limited travel and immigration from seven predominantly Muslim countries in the Middle East and Africa, was expected Wednesday after a federal court judge temporarily halted the original order in early February.

• Iraqi forces block IS Mosul counter-attack

• Two Iraq Shia militia leaders killed west of Mosul in a week

A military commander in the Iraqi Shia paramilitary organisation, the Popular Mobilisation Forces (PMF), has been killed in clashes with Daesh in the area of Tal Afar, west of Mosul. The killing is the second such slaying of a PMF military commander in the past week alone. The Iran-backed PMF, a formal part of the Iraqi military since last year, has been formally deployed west of Mosul since the operation to recapture Iraq's second city from Daesh extremists began on 17 October 2016. During



that time, the PMF has fought to capture the Turkmen-majority city of Tal Afar, about 60 kilometres west of Mosul.

• West Mosul fighting pushes over 28,000 Iraqis to flee

Over 28,000 people have fled since the start of a drive to retake west Mosul, as Iraqi forces closed in Wednesday on a road linking the city with a jihadist-held town to the west. West Mosul is the largest population centre still controlled by the Islamic State group, and its recapture would mark the effective end of the cross-border "caliphate" leader Abu Bakr al-Baghdadi announced from a mosque in the city more than two years ago.

• Revised Trump immigration order, delayed after speech, will not ban citizens from Iraq

President Trump's new executive order on immigration will not include a blanket ban on citizens from Iraq, among a host of other revisions meant to allay legal and diplomatic concerns, people familiar with the matter said. Late on Tuesday, the White House scrapped plans for Trump to sign a revised travel ban Wednesday afternoon, a person familiar with the matter said, marking the third time the administration has put off the matter since the president said that dangerous people might enter the country without a prohibition in place.

Following a meeting with UN chief negotiator Staffan de Mistura in Geneva, Syria's main opposition High Negotiations Committee (HNC) leader Nasr al-Hariri said: "We had a lengthy discussion with de Mistura and his team. The issue of political transition is now the main subject on the table of political discussions currently taking place in Geneva."
