352 Civilians Killed In the Strikes of the Int'l Coalition on Daesh's Sites in Iraq and Syria

352 civilians have been killed in US-led air strikes against the terrorist organization (Daesh) in Iraq and Syria since the coalition's operations began in 2014. "It continues to evaluate 42 reports of civilian deaths," the Joint Task Force said in its monthly assessment of civilian deaths of the US-led coalition operations against Daesh.

A total of 317 Iraqi civilians were killed and another 403 injured in acts of terrorism, violence and armed conflict in Iraq in April 2017*, according to casualty figures recorded by the United Nations Assistance Mission for Iraq (UNAMI). The number of civilians killed in April (not including police) was 309, while the number of injured (not including police) was 387.

• US Coalition admits killing at least 352 civilians in Syria, Iraq this month

At least 352 civilians were killed in airstrikes delivered by the US-led coalition in Syria and Iraq, the coalition said in its monthly civilian casualties report released on Sunday. "To date, based on information available, CJTF-OIR assesses that, it is more likely than not, at least 352 civilians have been unintentionally killed by Coalition strikes since the start of Operation Inherent Resolve," Combined Joint Task Force Operation Inherent Resolve said in the report.

-Major attack likely to regain control over old Mosul

Iraqi forces resumed battle on Monday to try to regain control over parts of Mosul amid expectations that the battle to reclaim the city's old area would be completed soon, sources on the ground have said. According to Major Ziad al-Zubaidi, the Iraqi army is targeting areas with heavy artillery close to Mosul while the coalition's air force continued its air raids targeting ISIS locations. A source added that armed men have detonated four car bombs in the past 24 hours. Federal police also announced the killing of dozens of ISIS members in the last few hours as a result of intensive air strikes.

Kasim Seso, a senior Peshmerga figure in Mosul's Sinjar district, said on Monday the PKK had suffered "big losses and financial damage" in the aftermath of the bombardments.
