• Two Russian servicemen killed in Syria mortar attack

Assad drops almost 70,000 barrel bombs on Syria, study finds

Bashar al Assad's regime has dropped almost 70,000 barrel bombs on Syria during the country's near seven-year civil war, according to a report released this week. The report, published by the non-profit Syrian Network for Human Rights (SNHR), is perhaps the most extensive study into the use of



the indiscriminate crude weapon and tracks how it became synonymous with the Assad regime's brutal war apparatus.

• Russia denies report that 7 planes destroyed in Syria attack - TASS

Russia denied a report in daily newspaper Kommersant that seven Russian planes had been destroyed by rebel shelling at Syria's Hmeymim air base on Dec. 31, the TASS news agency on Thursday quoted the defence ministry as saying. At least four Su-24 bombers, two Su-35S fighters and an An-72 transport plane, as well as an ammunition depot, were destroyed by the shelling, Kommersant said on its website, citing two "military-diplomatic" sources.

• Russian jets suspected to have killed 20 people in bombing run on houses near Damascus

Suspected Russian jets were reported to have killed at least 20 people today when they bombed two residential buildings in a besieged rebel enclave near Damascus. • 232 people killed by torture in Syria last year

The Syrian Network for Human Rights has documented the cases of 232 people killed last year while being tortured by the main actors of the conflict in Syria. Of these, 211, including one child and two women, were tortured to death by the Syrian regime. In a report issued on Tuesday, the organisation gave details of one person tortured to death by Daesh, and four people, including a child, killed under torture by Hay'at Tahrir Al-Sham. Furthermore, seven people were killed in this way by armed opposition factions; five were killed by the Kurdish autonomous region forces; and four by other parties.

• Protests in Iran are no reason to kill the nuclear deal

Opponents of the 2015 Iran nuclear deal have seized on the popular protests engulfing Iranian cities as a new reason for attacking the agreement. It is of no relevance to them that the protesters themselves are not denouncing the deal, formally known as the Joint Comprehensive Plan of Action (JCPOA), or calling for foreign sanctions against Iran. The logic, rather, seems to be that because protesters are criticising their government, foreign powers should, in solidarity, similarly attack the Tehran authorities by imposing economic penalties.

President Abdel Fatah al-Sisi approved on January 1 the amendments to Inheritance Law 77/1943, imposing strict sanctions on those who disinherit members of a family, particularly women, from receiving their rightful shares. Under these amendments, punishment of at least three years in prison and a fine ranging between LE 20,000-100,000 (around \$1,119-\$5,595) shall be imposed on violators.
