Speaking at a press conference in Baghdad following a meeting with his Iraqi counterpart Erfan al-Hiyali, Williamson said the liberation of Mosul from Islamic State was the second fiercest battle after the World War II.

## Judge orders potential release of hundreds of illegals from Iraq

A federal judge in Michigan has ordered the government to give bond hearings in preparation for releasing hundreds of illegal immigrants from Iraq into the community, saying the Constitution protects them from indefinite detention in the U.S. U.S. District Judge Mark A Goldsmith, an Obama appointee, earlier had halted deportations for nearly 300 Iraqis, saying that although they had long



been ordered removed, conditions on the ground in Iraq had changed and they deserved new hearings.

## 9 people killed and wounded in explosions in Baghdad

One person was killed and eight others wounded in two separate explosions in Latifiya and Duanem in Baghdad. #### Iraq to set up joint parliamentary panel with Kurds

Iraq will set up a parliamentary committee to resolve disputes with its Kurdish region including control over border crossings and sharing of oil revenue, a member of Prime Minister Haider Al Abadi's ruling bloc has said. "The two sides are about to form a seven-member committee, including five members from Baghdad and two others from Kurdistan. The committee will review all controversial issues between the two sides," an MP of the Shiite National Alliance told the pan-Arab newspaper Asharq Al Awsat.

## More than half of Irag's displaced have returned home

More than half of Iraqis displaced by conflict to other parts of the country have returned to their homes, the U.N. migration agency said Thursday. At the end of December, more than 3.2 million displaced Iraqis had gone home while 2.6 millions still lived away, the International Organization for Migration said. Iraqi forces have regained large swaths of the country from Daesh (ISIS) since the militants seized them in 2014, sending tens of thousands running for their lives.

## ISIS offensive to capture key base, town in southwest Syria backfires terribly

An attempt by Islamic State-affiliated militants to capture a key town and base in southwestern Syria from rebel forces has backfired battle despite initially making good progress. According to reports, on Thursday, units of the ISIS-linked Jaysh Khalid ibn al-Walid (also called the Saifullah al-Maslul Army) militant group attempted to capture the town of Ash-Sheikh Saye'ed and its nearby army artillery base (abandoned by Syrian forces years ago) from Free Syrian Army rebels in southwestern Daraa province.

#### Iran has invested \$1 billion in Syria, IDF chief says

Iran has invested billions of dollars in Syria and hundreds of millions of dollars in Iraq to expand its influence in the region, Israeli state television reported IDF Chief of Staff Gadi Eisenkot as saying Tuesday. Lebanon's Hezbollah allegedly receives between 700 million dollars and 1 billion dollars annually from Iran, the general said. In exchange, the militant Shia Islamist organisation has agreed to devote 40% of its resources to operations of interest to Iran in Syria and Yemen. Eisenkot claimed Iran also has over 2,000 advisors and experts as well as 10,000 Shia combatants in Syria.

## UN sounds alarm on Syria violence

The United Nations humanitarian wing and its partners in Syria on Wednesday expressed deep concern about the protection and well-being of tens of thousands of civilians in north-eastern Hama and southern Idlib governorates, following increased hostilities, which have reportedly resulted in scores of deaths and injuries and displacement in the area. A UN spokesperson said seven people were reportedly killed and at least 18 people injured after an air strike hit the Khan Elsobol town in Idlib. On the same day, 25 people were reportedly injured and several shops and facilities were damaged when shelling hit the main vegetable market in Jisr-AshShugur city in western rural Idlib.

## Russia Confirms Syria Attack But Denies Seven Aircraft Got Destroyed As Photos Emerge

The Russian Ministry of Defense has acknowledged an attack on its Khmeimim air base in Syria, but has disputed key details from an initial report, denying that seven aircraft had been destroyed in the incident. At the same time, unconfirmed pictures have begun emerging on social media showing significant damage to at least one Su-24 Fencer attack plane. On Jan. 4, 2017, the Russia's Ministry of Defense, by way of state-run media outlet TASS, said militants had attacked Khmeimim, also known as Hmeimim or Hmeymim, and killed two Russian service members in the process.

## 70,000 reasons why Assad has no place in Syria's future

Barrel bombs are old containers filled with crude explosives and shrapnel that explode on impact. As instruments of terror, they are a cheap, crude and effective way of killing and maiming at random in places packed with humanity. It comes as little surprise that Bashar Al Assad has made extensive use of barrel bombs to terrorise and subdue Syrians. According to a report published this week by the independent Syrian Network of Human Rights, the regime in Damascus dropped nearly 70,000 barrel bombs between July 2012 and December last year. At least 10,763 Syrians, many of them children, have lost their lives to these flying killing machines.

## Iranian diplomat charges US with inciting protests

#### Palestinians slam Israel bill to execute 'terrorists'

Palestinians have reacted angrily to an Israeli draft law -- a preliminary reading of which was approved on Wednesday -- that would allow Palestinian "terrorists" to be sentenced to death.
