• Iraqi Troops, Shiite Militias Defeat Islamic State in 'Last Stronghold' in Northern Iraq

U.S.-supported Iraqi government troops and Iran-allied Shiite militiamen have reportedly retaken the "last" Islamic State (ISIS/ISIL) bastion in northern Iraq, marking the latest sign that the jihadist group's so-called caliphate in the region is dwindling. In cooperation with U.S. troops, Iraqi government forces and Iran-backed Shiite Popular Mobilization Units/Forces (PMU/PMF) captured the northern Iraqi town of Hawija and the surrounding territory in the disputed province of Kirkuk, claimed by both Shiite-led Baghdad and the mainly Sunni Kurdistan Regional Government (KRG).

What Talabani's death means for the future of Iraq

Probably no president was ever called "uncle" by his eminent counterparts and by the people on the street. Yet in every Middle East country where Kurds live, "mam" ("paternal uncle" in Kurdish) was the honorific title of Jalal Talabani, a legend of Kurdish politics and former president of Iraq from 2005 to 2014. When they use honorific titles, Kurdish men are usually addressed as "kak," which translates to "sir." For example, his followers and Kurds in general often address Massoud Barzani, president of the Kurdistan Regional Government (KRG) of Iraq, as "Kak Massoud." Such a title of respect never suited Jalal Talabani. "Mam," however, was a sign of affection. I do not recall any time that I have addressed him in any other way in the more than 40 years we knew each other.

Syria fighting worst since Aleppo war: Aid groups

Syria is in the throes of its worst fighting since the battle for eastern Aleppo last year, with heavy air strikes causing hundreds of civilian casualties, aid agencies said on Thursday. Hospitals, schools and people fleeing violence have been "targeted by direct air strikes" that may amount to war crimes, the United Nations said, without apportioning blame. "September was the deadliest month of 2017 for civilians with daily reports of attacks on residential areas resulting in hundreds of conflict-related deaths and injuries," UN regional humanitarian coordinator Panos Moumtzis said in a statement.

European Union business leaders have said they are prepared to do everything they can to salvage the Iran nuclear deal in the event of a US withdrawal, as the Danish credit agency extended export guarantees to Tehran ahead of a showdown with Donald Trump. Adoption of electric vehicles and improved fuel efficiency could wipe out 3.5 million barrels a day of demand from cars by 2025, Barclays commodities analysts projected in a research note on Wednesday. That is roughly equivalent to the total production of OPEC's third-largest producer, Iran, which pumps about 3.8 million barrels a day, Reuters first noted.
