• KRG "could Suspend" Erbil Domestic Flights

A Kurdistan 24 press quoted Talar Faiq, the Director-General of Erbil International Airport (EIA) as saying that the KRG could suspend domestic flights between the Kurdistan Region's airports and the rest of Iraq due to financial issues and Baghdad's international flight ban. "Since the Iraqi government's ban went into effect late September 2017, Iraqi Airways has not paid for its landings at the EIA [for flights originating from Baghdad and other Iraqi airports]," Faiq said. "Baghdad owes the EIA an amount of 37 million USD for landing at the airport," the Director-General added.

A total of 91 Iraqi civilians were killed and another 208 injured in acts of terrorism, violence and armed conflict in Iraq in February 2018, according to casualty figures recorded by the United Nations Assistance Mission for Iraq (UNAMI). The figures include ordinary civilians and others who can be considered civilian at the time of death or injury - police in non-combat function, civil defence, Personal Security Details, facilities protection police, and fire department personnel, a UNIC-Tehran press release reported on Tuesday.

• Syria: Kremlin, smear campaign on use of chemical arms

Kremlin spokesman Dmitri Peskov on Tuesday said Russia believes that only international experts can draw conclusions on the use of chemical weapons in Syria and therefore, "given the lack of evidence,



such statements are nothing other than smear". "We believe that the only thing on which any allegation should be based is an international commission, the conclusion of an international working group", Peskov also said. "You can call it the way you want, but the result of an impartial investigation would be required".

• YPG/PKK blocking civilian exit from Afrin: UN

A humanitarian aid convoy turned back from Douma in the besieged Syrian enclave of eastern Ghouta on Monday after shelling in the town, coinciding with mortars fired on the capital Damascus, the International Committee of the Red Cross (ICRC) said. "The team is safe, but given the security situation, a decision was taken to go back for now. They off-loaded as much as possible given the current situation on the ground," ICRC spokeswoman Iolanda Jaquemet said in Geneva.

• War on Lebanon?

The Lebanese taxi driver was both happy and upset. "You Saudis and Gulf visitors are always good news for us," he started. "For years now we have fewer and fewer of you. Instead, we receive Iraqis, Afghanis and Iranians. Most of them come via Beirut on their way to Syria. Some are pilgrims visiting Shiite shrines, others are fighters joining Hezbollah and other (Iranian) militias. Few are diplomats or merchants. But in all cases, they don't spend much here.
