The demonstrators, bearing banners condemning the Tehran government, chanted slogans and said the Iranian intelligence would be held responsible for Shirazi's security and health.

#### • Seven Islamic State militants apprehended over plots to destabilize Mosul

An Iraqi official source said on Wednesday that Iraqi troops foiled a terrorist plot by the Islamic State (IS) group to destabilize the situation in Mosul through targeting vital facilities with bombs and assassinating public figures there. Speaking to the London-based Al-Quds Al-Arabi daily newspaper, the source said, "Security forces arrested a terrorist group made up of seven IS members, who planned to detonate commercial and vital areas in Mosul, as well as assassinating well-placed figures and robbing houses to make the situation in the city unstable."

#### • Christians Unwilling to Return to Mosul

Months after its liberation from the grip of the Islamic State (IS), Mosul in northern Iraq is yet to see its religious and ethnic minorities returning to their homes, said an official. "It is obvious that the greatest damage in Mosul is brought to Kurdish Yezidis, Shakas and Christians by the Daesh [IS]. Therefore, no Kurdish Yezidi, shabak and Christian has yet returned to the city," said Abdulqader Shingali, Deputy Governor of Nineveh Province.

#### • Iraq, UN launch joint plan to return 1 million displaced persons to their homes in 2018

The Iraqi government and the United Nations have launched the Humanitarian Response Plan which aims to help one million displaced Iraqis return to areas liberated from Daesh, the Iraqi Minister of Migration and Displacement, Hasem Mohammad Al-Jaf said Tuesday. Speaking at a joint press conference with the Secretary General of the Iraqi Council of Ministers, Mahdii Al-Alaq, Minister, al-Jaf said according to the plan one out of approximately 2.5 million displaced persons will return to their areas in addition to providing services and logistics for displaced people in refugee camps".

With the end of large-scale military offensives in late 2017, many families have been returning and are trying to rebuild their lives and homes. As many as two million displaced Iraqis are expected to return in 2018; hence, all efforts must be made to support them in this transition. This year approximately 8.7 million people, nearly half of them children, will require some form of humanitarian assistance.

Iraq has just scored 18 out of 100 for transparency whereas 0 would be most corrupt and 100 the least, according to reports. According to Transparency International which has used World Bank data, the World Economic Forum, and additional institutions to rank 180 countries by perceived levels of corruption, amongst the 21 countries in the Middle East and North Africa, only Libya, Syria, and Yemen have scored less than Iraq.

#### • Russian military plane crash in Syria kills dozens

The An-26 plane crashed during landing at Hmeimim airbase, near the coastal city of Latakia, the ministry is quoted as saying by Russian media. It says all 39 military personnel on board died, not 32 as earlier reported. The plane was not fired upon, the ministry says, and preliminary data suggests a technical malfunction could have caused the crash.

#### • More than 1,000 children killed or injured this year in Syria, UN says

The grim statistic, from UNICEF regional communications chief Juliette Touma, comes as violence rips through the rebel-held enclave of Eastern Ghouta, where about a third of the nearly 400,000 besieged civilians are children, according to the agency. In all, 342 children were killed and 803 were injured in Syria in the first two months of 2018, Touma said, citing multiple sources.

# • US-led forces accused of breaking international law in Syria air strike that killed 150 people

United Nations investigators have accused the US-led coalition of breaking international law in an air strike on territory held by the Islamic State (IS) group near Raqqa in March last year. The investigators, from the Independent International Commission of Inquiry on Syria, said the strike at al-Mansoura on the night of March 20 killed "at least 150" people, as US-backed forces closed in on Raqqa, the defacto capital of the so-called caliphate.

#### Russia offers rebels safe passage out of eastern Ghouta
