## • Sunni Arabs Ask for Coalition Forces in Nineveh Plains

The Sunni Arab tribes of Nineveh Plains in northern Iraq have renewed a call on the US-led coalition forces and the Kurdish Peshmerga to protect them against the Iranian-backed militias of Hashd al-Shaabi. Calling the Shi'ite militias "mercenaries", Sheikh Muzahim al-Hawet, the spokesperson for the Sunni Arab tribes, told German media that Hashd al-Shaabi's mission in their area is to create further instability.

## • Three months after Baghdad took control, tensions high in Kirkuk

In a Jan. 4 meeting with a delegation representing Kurdistan's opposition parties, Iraqi Prime Minister Haider al-Abadi said that an agreement has been reached to calm the situation in Kirkuk province and in the district of Tuz Khormato. The retaking of Kirkuk by the Iraqi army in October has changed the balance of power in the oil-rich town that had been under full control of the Kurds since 2014.



The operation was part of Baghdad's retaliatory measures after the Kurds held an independence referendum that has since been declared illegal.

## Iraq returning displaced civilians from camps to unsafe areas

Iraqi security forces are forcibly returning civilians from refugee camps to unsafe areas in the predominantly Sunni Anbar province, exposing them to death from booby-traps or acts of vigilantism, refugees and aid workers say. Managing more than two million Iraqis displaced by the war against Islamic State is one of Prime Minister Haider al-Abadi's most daunting tasks. But critics say he is more interested in winning elections in May than alleviating the suffering of displaced Iraqis and returning them safely home.

Iraq's parliament voted on Monday to ban Kurdish engineering firm Kar Group from operating Kirkuk's oilfields, following Iraq's recapture of the Kurdish-held oil region in October. The Kurds have withdrawn from most Kirkuk oilfields since October but the vote came after lawmakers said the Kar



Group refused to cooperate with Iraq's state-run North Oil Co. (NOC) and hand back the Khurmala oilfield.

## • US Plans to Recognize Kurdish Area in Syria

Arab media reports claimed that Washington is planning 'concrete steps' toward providing a Syrian Democratic Forces-controlled area in Northern Syria's Eastern Euphrates region three times the size of Lebanon with diplomatic recognition. An unnamed senior Western official was quoted by Asharq Al-Awsat newspaper as saying that the 28,000 square km territory, controlled by the Syrian Democratic Forces (SDF), a collection of predominantly Kurdish militias including the YPG People's Protection Units, took its first step toward US recognition after US Defense Secretary Jim Mattis



promised to send US diplomats to SDF-controlled areas to work alongside US troops operating in the region.

#### • Russian Military Delivers Humanitarian Aid to Bukain Village in Western Syria

#### • Iran's Revolutionary Guard announces overwhelms unrest

## • Arab League plans to persuade UN to recognise Palestine

Arab states will soon embark on a diplomatic drive to persuade the United Nations to recognise a Palestinian state with East Jerusalem as its capital on territory captured by Israel in the 1967 war, Jordan's Foreign Minister Ayman Safadi said.
