Erbil Hands Over a Protest Letter to the Iranian Consulate Accusing It of Running the Recent Demonstrations

The Kurdistan Regional Government (KRG) handed over an official letter to the Iranian consulate in Erbil expressing its protest and concern over the statements of the Secretary-General of Iran's Expediency Council, Mohsen Rezai that the Iranian protests were planned and managed by Erbil. The Foreign Relations Department of the Kurdistan Regional Government said in a press statement: "The official of external relations in the Kurdistan Regional Government, Falah Mustafa held a meeting with Deputy General Consul General Siamak Borhani and handed him an official letter expressing the protest and concern of the Kurdistan Regional Government about the statements of the Secretary-General of Iran's Expediency Council Mohsen Rezai, who said that the Iranian protests were planned and run by Erbil. Development Program's Funding Facility for Stabilization will go to addressing minority groups in areas of Northern Iraq re-taken from the Islamic State, USAID said Monday.

Systemic Crisis In Kurdistan Region Of Iraq – Analysis

To achieve stability and prosperity, the Kurdish Region of Iraq needs to address the politicization of its institutions. This problem has been years in the making, and it will take considerable effort to enact meaningful reforms. However, doing so is the best path forward for Iraqi Kurds. The Kurdistan Regional Government (KRG) has been facing a systemic crisis since its establishment in 1992. First,



despite many attempts to depoliticize the KRG's Peshmerga armed forces, they remain divided. The Kurdistan Democratic Party (KDP) and the Patriotic Union of Kurdistan (PUK) were two armed groups fighting the Iraqi state during 1970s and 1980s, and they have kept their military and security forces under their own control even after the rise of KRG.

Mortar Barrage on Tuz Khormato; 26 Killed in Iraq

The United States has struck a deal with the United Nations to deliver more aid to ethnic and religious minority groups in Iraq. A mortar attack on Tuz Khormato left 12 wounded, including children. Turkman M.P. Jasim Mohammed Jaafar blamed the attack on Kurdish rebels.

Russian Bases in Syria Attacked by 13 Drones

Russia said that fighters have used unmanned airplanes against its military base Hymeim and its naval base Tartus in Syria. The defense ministry announced that attacks on Saturday night were successfully stopped by Russian troops and did not cause casualties or destruction. They used 13 armed unmanned aircrafts, TASS reported. The Russian troops were able to catch six unmanned aircraft and seven were destroyed by the air defense. According to the Ministry of Defense, the means used in the attacks could only be obtained from developed countries with high technology capabilities.

At least 130 civilians killed in Syria's Eastern Ghouta in 11 days

Shelling and air strikes on Eastern Ghouta, which the Syrian regime forces have besieged for four years, have killed at least 130 civilians in the last 11 days, the Syrian Observatory for Human Rights said on Tuesday. The semi-rural area east of the Syrian capital is home to around 400,000 inhabitants and is targeted almost daily by regime forces trying to flush out opposition factions and militant groups.

With millions of desperate people across Syria now facing their seventh winter of war, the United Nations warned on Tuesday that intensified military operations in the country's north are forcing families to flee, in the cold, to areas without enough resources to support them. "While some parts of Syria are witnessing a welcome reprieve from hostilities, many others face intensified military operations and conflict," UN Spokesman Stéphane Dujarric told the regular briefing in New York, noting that more than 13 million people in the country need basic aid and protection.

The App Powering the Uprising in Iran

The streets of Iran are calming down after more than a week of protests about fundamental issues—jobs, corruption, the cost of food—that quickly took on political overtones. Many demonstrators called for an end to the theocratic regime's costly adventures outside Iran's borders, and, in a few cases, an end to that regime altogether. The demonstrations took place more or less spontaneously in cities and towns all over the country, and the government at first appeared confused, with hardliners blaming moderates, moderates blaming hardliners, and, of course, many in the regime claiming this was all a plot by Iran's foreign enemies: the U.S., Israel, and Saudi Arabia. But by late last week, the government had largely reasserted control over the streets, and the big question that looms is, "What next?"
