• Czech Planes Arrive in Iraq; 13 Killed in Iraq

The Iraqi military received two Czech-made L-159 fighter jets, bringing the number of these Czech planes to eight total. At least 13 were killed and 11 were wounded: In Taji, one person was killed and three more were wounded in a blast. A teacher was shot dead on a highway between Baquba and Khalis. In Abu Ghraib, a roadside bomb wounded two soldiers.
