Holding Iraq's parliament and local elections as scheduled will represent a "military coup, Iraq's largest Sunni alliance said as the government pushes forward with the first election after the defeat of Islamic State militants. Raad al-Dahlaki, a senior member of the Alliance of Iraqi Forces, told Baghdad Today that "holding the elections under the current circumstances will represent a military coup against the political process by allowing the ascension of military commanders to assume the government's political helm".

Why is Iraq now stripping Palestinians of their rights?

The Arabi21 news website revealed Dec. 20 that Iraqi President Fuad Masum had approved Law No. 76 of 2017, which stripped Palestinian refugees living in Iraq of their rights and classified them as foreigners. The law came into effect after being published in the Iraqi Gazette. The new law replaced Law No. 202 of 2001, issued by former President Saddam Hussein, forcing the Iraqi state to treat Palestinians as equals to Iraqis, with all privileges and citizenship rights, such as tax exemption, opportunities to work in government departments, and access to education and health care services.

Iraq parliament forms committee to investigate war crimes in Tuz Khurmatu

The Iraqi parliament has voted to set up a committee to investigate possible war crimes in the multi-ethnic town of Tuz Khurmatu following its recapture by Iraqi forces from Kurdish Peshmerga fighters. Tuz Khumatu, located 90 kilometres south of the disputed oil-rich city of Kirkuk, has been at the forefront of deep sectarian tensions for the past few years. The multi-ethnic town is home to Turkmen, Arabs and Kurds and was among the contested areas recaptured by Iraqi troops and progovernment mainly Shiite militias in October last year in the wake of the Kurdish independence referendum.

Following the 2005 election of Iraq's National Assembly, the winning Shia Islamist coalition selected Ibrahim al-Jaafari, then a senior leader in the Dawa party, for the position of Prime Minister in the transitional government. Dawa is the oldest Shia Islamist party, but not the largest. Competing groups within the Shia alliance selected a member in the party for the position to sustain minimal



unity, which was threatened by the fierce competition between the Islamic Supreme Council of Iraq (ISCI) and the Sadrist movement.

Russian oil major piles up investments in Iraq's Kurdistan amid crisis

Russian state oil major Rosneft has agreed to invest \$400 million in five oil blocks in Iraqi Kurdistan, increasing Moscow's exposure to the semi-autonomous region despite a major spike in tensions with the central government in Baghdad. Rosneft has previously loaned Kurdistan \$1.2 billion guaranteed by oil sales and is seeking to help Arbil build two major oil and gas pipelines as part of Russian President Vladimir Putin's drive to regain influence in the Middle East.

Iraq cracks down on online gun sales

Iraq is upping its efforts to restrict the public's access to weapons, which will be a daunting task given the prevalence of weapons on the market and their wide exchange on social media. When the country's top Shiite cleric, Ayatollah Ali al-Sistani, demanded Dec. 15 that the government escalate operations to put all weapons under its control, Iraqi Prime Minister Haider al-Abadi announced a plan to do just that. At times in the past, sales were blatant and widespread; after the fall of Saddam Hussein in 2003, weapons were sold on the streets in most Iraqi cities. That's no longer the case — but now dealers have the internet.

Children killed in Syria airstrikes during UN aid chief visit

More than 1,370 Afghan civilians killed in 8 months

As many as 1,372 civilians lost their lives and 2,360 others sustained wounds in violent incidents during the last eight months of 2017 in Afghanistan, the Civilian Protection Advocacy Group (CPAG) said on Wednesday. Announcing CPAG findings on civilian casualties, the group's deputy head, Abdul Rahim Khurram told reporters here that most of the causalities resulted from suicide bombings, airstrikes and ground operations and mostly in Kabul, Nangarhar, Herat, Ghor, Kunduz and Helmand provinces.
