Raqqa's post-ISIS stabilization is as important as the battle itself

Even before the main battle to remove Islamic State (ISIS) from the Syrian city of Raqqa began, the United States made it clear that it is not going to contribute to post-ISIS humanitarian and stabilization efforts there. This may prove problematic as such efforts are essential to solidify the battlefield defeat of the militants. "In terms of administrative services [in Raqqa], teachers, hospitals, who pays those salaries, that is something where Syrians are going to have to work that out," Brett McGurk, the US presidential envoy to the US-led coalition against ISIS, previously has said. "We are not in the business of, as I said, nation-building operations."

The comment came in a statement issued by the Kremlin after the call on Tuesday, more than a week after Saudi Arabia, Bahrain, the United Arab Emirates and Egypt cut diplomatic ties with Qatar and closed their air, sea and land borders for the country, accusing it of supporting "extremists" and Iran, charges that Qatar calls "baseless".
