• Iraqi police recapture railway station, garage near Mosul's Old City

Iraqi Federal Police recaptured Tuesday a railway station near western Mosul's Old City as forces sweep through areas near the strategic Islamic State stronghold. Alsumaria News said in breaking news that Federal Police took over the Nineveh Railway Station, with operations continuing to clear western Mosul from IS militants amid tough resistance from the group coupled with inclement weather conditions. • West Mosul: No Escape from Smell of Blood

A person walking in the liberated streets of western Mosul does not miss the smell of fire and death. The first smell emanates from the ruins of a shooting between Iraqi forces and ISIS militants in the Old City. The second smell comes from the bodies of Iraqi and foreign militants that fill the narrow streets next to the still wet spots of blood covering the roads and walls of western Mosul.

• Iraq: Hundreds Detained in Degrading Conditions

The Iraqi interior ministry is holding at least 1,269 detainees, including boys as young as 13, without charge in horrendous conditions and with limited access to medical care at three makeshift prisons, Human Rights Watch said today. At least four prisoners have died, in cases that appear to be linked to lack of proper medical care and poor conditions and two prisoners' legs have been amputated, apparently because of lack of treatment for treatable wounds.

• Sunni politician warns U.S. of mounting civilian casualties in Mosul

A prominent Iraqi Sunni politician on Monday warned Washington the acceleration in a military campaign in western Mosul to drive out Islamic State jihadists was causing a sudden surge in civilian casualties that threatened to undermine the effort to crush the militants. Khamis Khanjar, who has used his leverage to lobby the U.S. administration and the Iraqi authorities to ensure the major campaign in Mosul minimizes civilian losses among its population, said at least 3,500 civilians have been killed since the push into the western side of the side last month.

• Iraqi army advance slowed at edge of Mosul's Old City

The anti-IS coalition is on the edge of the Old City and close to capturing the third of Mosul's five bridges. But strong resistance from jihadists and bad weather has slowed down the progress of the Iraqi military. Iraqi forces reportedly made new gains but were also slowed down in their attempt to retake western Mosul on Monday. State troops have pushed so-called "Islamic State" (IS) militants into Mosul's Old City, having captured territory at the edge of the historic neighborhoods, and just south of the old bridge.

• Female Iraqi MP proposes law that encourages men to marry multiple women for financial benefits

A member of Iraq's parliament has put forward a proposal to legalise polygamy in the country to "protect the dignity" of widows, divorced women, and older women who choose not to marry. The government could provide financial incentives such as tax allowances to encourage men to marry more than one woman, Jamila al-Ebeidi told media at Baghdad's parliament's building on Sunday, citing increased rates of divorce as a social problem which puts women in financially dangerous positions.
