A Finnish university study found that Iran could achieve a zero-emissions grid by 2030 with a capital expenditure of €167 billion (\$187 billion). Iran, one of the world's largest oil producers, would need to develop about 49 gigawatts of solar power, 77 gigawatts of wind energy and 21 gigawatts of hydropower. A green grid could also make water desalinization cost-effective. Water scarcity is a serious and growing problem in Iran.
