Islamic State militants have kidnapped 16 civilians from a region in Anbar to an unknown destination, the region's mayor said. Muayyad Farhan told Alsumaria News Wednesday that IS militants had kidnapped the civilians from al-Rouda, a district on the road between Rahaliyah and Ramadi which, he said. is totally empty of security presence. He urged the government to secure a pathway for Rahaliyah civilians.

• Isis claims propaganda 'more powerful than atomic bomb' as group forms strategy for survival

Isis' propaganda will continue to radicalise followers and inspire terror attacks long after the group's self-declared caliphate has been destroyed, a new report has warned. The terrorist group is losing swathes of territory in its Iraqi stronghold of Mosul as enemy forces advance on its de-facto capital of Raqqa in Syria, but continues to churn out online magazines, videos and continual updates on its "operations" to followers around the world.

• Official: U.S. military used depleted uranium for first time since 2003 Iraq invasion

Officials have confirmed that the U.S. military, despite vowing not to use depleted uranium weapons on the battlefield in Iraq and Syria, fired thousands of rounds of the munitions during two highprofile raids on oil trucks in Islamic State-controlled Syria in late 2015. The air assaults mark the first

• Iraq Plans for Enormous Boost To Refining Capacity

Iraq's government is ambitious and it wants to make the most of the country's oil and gas reserves. Plans for an expansion of the country's refinery network have been circulating for years, but the war with IS has put these on hold. What's worse is that the prospects for these plans are gloomy unless it gets a significant amount of external help. Before the war with IS engulfed OPEC's second-largest exporter, plans were to add five new refineries to the network over a period of 20 years, starting in 2008. At the time, the refining capacity of Iraq stood around 886,000 bpd.
