However, videos of him mistreating corpses started circulating online at the beginning of June — and they could see him lose his hero status.

The Pentagon will send almost 4,000 additional American troops to Afghanistan in order to break a stalemate in a 16-year-long war, according to the Associated Press, citing a "Trump administration official." The official told the AP that the move by Defense Secretary James Mattis could be



announced "as early as next week." A U.S. official told Breitbart News that "no decisions have been made yet."
