• Iraq orders arrest for Kurdistan VP for anti-army remarks

A top Iraqi court ordered Thursday the arrest of Kurdistan Region's vice president over hostile remarks he made of Iraqi forces which took over the disputed Kirkuk province earlier this week. The Rusafa investigation court in Baghdad ordered the arrest of Kosrat Rasul, a deputy secretary-general of the Patriotic Union of Kurdistan, for having described Iraqi forces as "occupier forces" as they retook control over Kirkuk, said a statement by the Higher Judicial Council's spokesman, Abdul-Sattar Beraqdar.

The Iraqi military has seized several important areas in northwestern Iraq this week, forcing the Kurdish Peshmerga to abandon their posts, often without a fight. The Iraqi military began the week by seizing the provincial capital of Kirkuk, K1 Base, and its nearby oil fields, including the Bai Hassan and Dibs refineries. Following the seizure of Kirkuk, the Iraqi forces shifted their focus to the Yazidi populated city of Sinjar in Iraq's northwestern countryside.

• Iran is violating the deal

Iran is not only violating the spirit of the no-nukes deal, it is violating its letter. The prologue to the deal explicitly states: "Iran reaffirms that under no circumstances will Iran ever seek, develop or acquire any nuclear weapons." This reaffirmation has no sunset provision: it is supposed to be



forever. Yet the International Atomic Energy Agency (IAEA) recently stated that it could not verify that Iran was "fully implementing the agreement" by not engaging in activities that would allow it to make a nuclear explosive device. Yukiya Amano of the IAEA told Reuters that when it comes to inspections, which are stipulated in Section T of the agreement, "our tools are limited."

• Iran calls for nuclear action against US accusing Washington of 'creating ISIS'

Sayyid Ali Hosseini Khamenei said the Trump administration is angry with Tehran for disrupting their plans in Lebanon, Syria and Iraq. He added that "it is not acceptable for the Zionist regime to violate Syria any time it wants". It comes at a time of increased tensions between the two nations – after Donald Trump ruled out re-signing Barack Obama's nuclear weapons agreement with the Islamic Republic.
