Army chief: Future of US troops in Iraq TBD as ISIS crumbles

The U.S. Army chief of staff, who recently returned from a trip to Iraq, said U.S. troops there will continue to help Iraqi security forces root out Islamic State militants, but what comes after that for the Army in the war-torn country remains to be seen. "I think the situation in Iraq is a lot different than it was three or four years ago when ISIS came rolling out of the desert and screaming down the



Euphrates River Valley," Gen. Mark Milley told reporters Jan. 17 following an Association of the U.S. Army breakfast in Arlington, Virginia.

Plans to export natural gas from Iraqi Kurdistan got a boost after reserves were upgraded at two key fields. Yet successful development still hinges on the region's turbulent politics. The Miran and Bina Bawi deposits hold 14.8 billion cubic feet of contingent gas resources, explorer Genel Energy Plc said Friday in a statement after an audit was carried out by RPS Energy Consultants Ltd. That's an increase of more than 40 percent from the previous estimate in 2016.

Over 200,000 People Displaced in Syria's Idlib in 30 Days: UN

Fighting in Syria's northwestern province of Idlib has displaced last month more than 200,000 people — some for the second time during the war — complicating relief efforts for the affected civilians, a UN spokesman has said. Afghanistan Strikes Increase Significantly in 2017

US aircraft finished 2017 flying combat missions in Afghanistan at the fastest rate in years—dropping more bombs last year than any other year since 2011 as the war on ISIS in Iraq and Syria hit its lowest total since it began. After an initial salvo involving F-22s, aircraft including F-18s, B-52s, F-16s, and MQ-9s hit 11 more narcotics facilities in Helmand Province.
