#### • Iraq Fighting Triggers Humanitarian Crisis Near Baghdad

Fighting between Islamic State and Iraqi security forces has displaced at least 90,000 civilians in the past several days, the United Nations said on Sunday, as a new humanitarian crisis unfolded on the fringes of the capital. Thousands of displaced people carried what few belongings they could across a floating bridge that forms the only connection between Anbar province—the heartland of Iraq's Sunni minority—and Baghdad over the weekend. Most were fleeing the embattled city of Ramadi—Anbar's provincial capital about 60 miles west of Baghdad. Fighting in Anbar intensified two weeks ago when provincial officials announced the start of a campaign to clear the province of Islamic State insurgents.

#### • An Iraqi Shiite militia group says DNA proves Saddam's right-hand man is dead

An Iraqi Shi'ite militia group said on Sunday it had conducted DNA tests to prove the death of Ezzat al-Douri, former right-hand man to the late president Saddam Hussein, who after the 2003 U.S. invasion was ranked by Washington as the sixth most-wanted Iraqi. The Kataib Hizbollah group published a video on Saturday showing its fighters undressing the body of the man believed to be Douri, who was laid out on a metal trolley, and snipping off a piece of his flame-red beard.



"The final results prove that the body belongs to the criminal Ezzat al-Douri," the group's spokesman Jaafar Husseini told Reuters, saying his DNA had been tested in the Iranian-backed Kataib Hizbollah's own special hospitals. He did not reveal details of where those hospitals were located. "We are 100 per cent certain," he added without elaborating.

#### • EU condemns 'criminal' killing of Ethiopian Christians

The European Union denounced Monday the slaughter of at least 28 Ethiopian Christians in an ISIS video as a "criminal" effort to create religious divisions. "This not a clash of civilizations, this not a fight between Islam and the West," an EU spokesman said in a statement. "This is a criminal misuse of a noble religion to perpetrate terrorist attacks in a struggle for power." The video released Sunday by the jihadi group shows militants in Libya shooting and beheading captives, who are described in text captions as "followers of the cross from the enemy Ethiopian Church." "The EU stands together with the growing number of countries in Africa, which are battling terrorism and radicalization," the statement said.

#### • World Health Organization steps up response to growing health needs of Anbar IDPs

Thousands of displaced people are crowded on the other side of the bridge in Amiriyat Al Falluja city. Health needs of the IDPs in this city are being met by WHO partner, UIMS which runs the IDPs Primary Health Care Center (PHCC) which was constructed and is supported by WHO. Six ambulances are deployed at Rudhwaniya to address the immediate health needs and provide the required healthcare. Two well-equipped mobile clinics, procured in June 2014 by WHO with financial support of the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia, will also arrive at the site shortly.

#### • ISIL executed 6,000 in Iraq's Anbar: Reports

Media reports quoted official sources in Anbar as saying that the executions have taken place mainly in the city of Fallujah as well as the provincial capital, Ramadi, which are still under control of the ISIL terrorists. The United Nations has said ISIL's advance in the province and fierce fighting have forced tens of thousands of people to flee the region. According to the UN Humanitarian Agency, more than 90,000 people have fled Ramadi and three nearby villages. #### • 26 Airstrikes hit ISIL hideouts in Iraq

The United States and its coalition partners targeted Islamic State militants with 36 air strikes in Syria and Iraq in a 24-hour, a statement from the Combined Joint Task Force. 26 of the strikes were in Iraq, hitting tactical units, sniper positions, weapons, vehicles and buildings near the cities of Fallujah, Kirkuk, Ramadi and Mosul. Near the Syrian cities of al Hasakah and Kobani, 10 air strikes destroyed an Islamic State fighting position, the statement said.

#### • Ramadi exodus compounds Iraq humanitarian crisis

Some pushed wheelbarrows piled high with their belongings across the only bridge to Baghdad. Others balanced battered suitcases on their heads, or held babies aloft so they would not be crushed in the exodus from Iraq's western province of Anbar. More than 90,000 people have fled their homes in Anbar since April 8, when Islamic State militants began gaining ground around the provincial capital Ramadi, about 90 km (55 miles) from Baghdad, the United Nations said on Sunday. The latest migration compounds an intensifying humanitarian crisis in Iraq, where 2.7 million people have been displaced within the country since January 2014.

The Independent High Commission for Human Rights said that it has spotted individual's actions in some security checkpoints in the capital Baghdad, by preventing or delaying the entry of Anbar's displaced people to move in areas of the capital. # • 'Iran wants OPEC to pave way for its extra oil production when sanctions lifted'

"Members of the Organization of the Petroleum Exporting Countries (OPEC) should prepare for extra Iranian crude production when Western sanctions on Tehran are lifted, Iran's oil minister was quoted on Tuesday by state news agency IRNA as saying. "We expect the members of OPEC to pave the ground for (an) increase of Iran's oil production that will reach global markets when sanctions are lifted," Bijan Namdar Zanganeh said during a meeting with his Venezuelan counterpart Asdrubal Chavez in Tehran, the agency reported. Iran, once OPEC's second-largest producer after Saudi Arabia, hopes to boost crude exports by as much as 1 million barrels per day (bpd) if Tehran and six major powers finalize a nuclear agreement by a June 30 deadline. Sanctions imposed by the European Union and the United States have halved Iran's oil exports to just over 1 million barrels per day since 2012. Lower oil prices have also caused pain for OPEC's less wealthy producers like Iran, which has repeatedly called for an output cut of OPEC's target daily production. But Gulf OPEC members, including Saudi Arabia, have refused to cut output that is currently at 30 million bpd."

#### • 'US warship heads to Yemeni waters; could block Iran weapons'

"The Navy aircraft carrier, USS Theodore Roosevelt is steaming toward the waters off the country to beef up security and join other American ships that are prepared to intercept any Iranian vessels carrying weapons to the Houthi rebels. #### • 'Iran and Australia agree to share intelligence on Daesh foreign fighters'

"Australia and Iran will share intelligence to track foreign fighters working with the Islamic State (Daesh) group in Iraq, Foreign Minister Julie Bishop said on Monday, as lawmakers urged caution. In the first trip to Iran by an Australian minister in more than a decade, Bishop said it would be an informal arrangement. Her comments came after a meeting with Iranian counterpart Mohammad Javad Zarif, President Hassan Rouhani and Ali Akbar Velayati, foreign affairs advisor to Supreme Leader Ayatollah Ali Khamenei. "We have a common purpose with Iran in defeating Daesh and helping the Iraqi government," she told the Australian Broadcasting Corporation, using an Arabic acronym to refer to the militant IS group. "During my discussions with the national leadership here, it was agreed that we could share intelligence, particularly on the foreign terrorist fighters from Australia who are taking part in this conflict in Iraq." More than 100 Australians have travelled to Iraq and Syria to fight with the militants, raising concerns about the threat of 'home-grown' extremists. On Saturday, two men were arrested in Melbourne for allegedly planning an IS-inspired attack at Anzac Day commemorations on April 25 honouring soldiers who fought and died for Australia. Bishop said Tehran had a strong military presence and long relationship with Iraq, coupled with a sophisticated intelligence network in places where Canberra had no presence."

#### • 'Salam Says No to Unilateral Governance, Urges Speedy Election of President'

"Prime Minister Tammam Salam warned Lebanon's bickering political parties on Tuesday that they would fail in governing the country without consensus, urging them to elect a new president without



further delay. "Lebanon is the only thing we've got. Putting it in danger is an unforgivable crime" such as the crime of the presidential vacuum, Salam said at the Lebanese Education Conference that was held at the Phoenicia hotel in Beirut. "No political party is capable of changing the circumstances in the region ... No single side would be able to succeed alone in deciding the fate of the country," he stressed. "No side would be able to manage our internal affairs ... away from consensus," the premier stated. Salam also urged all parties to speed up the election of a president to regulate the work of state institutions and normalize the country's constitutional life. The country has been without a head of state since President Michel Suleiman's six-year term ended in May last year. Differences between the March 8 and 14 alliances over a compromise candidate have caused the vacuum at Baabda Palace. Salam urged political parties to avoid verbal attacks and consolidate dialogue and rapprochement."

#### • 'Samaha confesses to bombing plot'

"Former Minister Michel Samaha confessed Monday that he had transported explosives into Lebanon with the aim of targeting Lebanese politicians and religious figures, claiming that he was lured to do so by a police intelligence agent. In a startling confession which shocked relatives, journalists and defense attorneys attending the military tribunal, Samaha detailed a plot which, if successfully implemented, could have pushed Lebanon into a cycle sectarian violence. Samaha appeared confused at times, faltering and contradicting himself, but claimed he was being watched by domestic and foreign intelligence services who convinced him to carry out the act, "satisfying my ambitions," and that they used people close to him to persuade him to cooperate. "I fell into an intelligence trap set by Milad Kfoury, who [had been] my friend since 1992," Samaha said, referring to the Internal Security Forces informant who revealed the plot."

Maronite Patriarch Beshara al-Rahi is scheduled to travel to Armenia on Tuesday to attend the centenary commemoration of the Armenian genocide. Free Patriotic Movement chief MP Michel Aoun telephoned al-Rahi to wish him luck in his trip, the state-run National News Agency reported. They also discussed the developments in Lebanon and the region, it said. Armenians in Armenia and the diaspora, including Lebanon, will on April 24 mark the 100th anniversary of the start of a campaign of genocide by Ottoman forces in World War I to wipe them out of Anatolia. Turkey on



Monday sought to reach out to Armenians, saying it shared their pain and wanted to heal the wounds of the past. In his conciliatory message, Prime Minister Ahmet Davutoglu stopped well short of recognizing the killings as a genocide -- as Armenians want -- but explicitly referred to deadly deportations of "Ottoman Armenians." Historians estimate that up to 1.5 million Armenians were killed by Ottoman Turks around the time of World War I, an event widely viewed by scholars as the first genocide of the 20th century. Turkey however, denies that the deaths constituted genocide, saying the toll has been inflated, and that those killed were victims of civil war and unrest."

#### • 'Naimi says Saudi oil production near record high in April'

"Oil Minister Ali al-Naimi says Saudi Arabia is producing near record levels of crude in April, underscoring the kingdom's willingness to defend market share at a time when oil markets have staged a fragile recovery. There are worries among some producers that growing output from Saudi Arabia and other members of the Organization of the Petroleum Exporting Countries (OPEC) could snuff out a recent rebound in oil prices, particularly with economic growth in key consumer China the slowest in six years in the first quarter. OPEC had said its overall output surged to 30.79 million barrels per day in March, up 810,000 bpd from the previous month, with demand higher than expected due to lower prices. Naimi said that oil production in Saudi Arabia, the world's biggest crude exporter, was "around 10 million" bpd in April. "I have said many times we will always be happy to supply to our customers with what they want. Now they want 10 million," Naimi said in an



interview in the South Korean capital, where he is due to attend a board meeting of the state oil firm Saudi Aramco. Responding to the comments, benchmark Brent crude slipped from early highs to trade under \$64 a barrel."

"It's a nightly exercise in futility: Yemen's Houthis fire rifles at Saudi F-15 jets thundering overhead. But the guerrillas' Kalashnikovs would be more formidable if and when Saudi Arabia decided to fight a ground war. Cairo and Riyadh said this month they were discussing a "major military manoeuvre" in Saudi Arabia, a sign the Saudi-led alliance bombing the Houthis may make good on threats to launch a ground push across the kingdom's southern border into Yemen. A 2009-2010 war against government forces backed by Saudi Arabia left around 200 Saudi soldiers dead."

The Permanent Representative of Morocco to the United Nations, Omar Hilale, sent a letter last Monday to the Security Council in which he called on the council members to coerce Algeria into respecting its international obligations with regards to the protection of refugees. Omar Hilale stressed that the report confirms "with supporting evidence the fraudulent, systematic, large-scale embezzlement of humanitarian aid destined for these camps, and the proven responsibility of Algeria and the Polisario in this regard."

#### 'Afghan Farmers Receive New Agricultural Machineries'

As a result, farmers in Bamyan



are discouraged to grow potatoes on their lands. Costing USD 1000, the new machine will replace the manual works of the farmers and encourage farmers to grow more potatoes."

#### • '6 would-be suicide bombers held in Jalalabad'

"At least six would-be suicide bombers and organizers were arrested in eastern Nangarhar province on Tuesday, the spy service said. According to a statement from the National Directorate of Security (NDS), the six-member group was detained in Ghani Khail district of the province. Qari Rahmatullah known as Qari Usman who was the ringleader of the group along with five others detained during a special operation in 27-Weyali area of the district. The arrested men included Abdul Bari, Sher Afzal, Shamshad, Samar Gul and Mirwais who were planning to carry out suicide attacks in the province. Suicide vests, Afghan National Army (ANA) soldier uniforms and explosives were also seized from the detainees, the statement added. The rebels have arrested after a suicide attack in Jalalabad city, the capital of Nangarhar, left 35 people dead and 125 others wounded last Saturday."

#### • 'Record number of 17 death row prisoners hanged'

"A record number of 17 death row convicts were sent to the gallows in different jails of Pakistan on early Tuesday morning. Of them, three death row prisoners were hanged in Faisalabad. Death sentence prisoner Nizam Din had killed a man in 1998 while Muhammad Hussain was guilty of killing his opponent. Another prisoner Muhammad Azam was guilty of killing seven members of his in-laws family. Three prisoners were hanged in Rawalpindi's Adiyala Jail on Tuesday. Executed death row prisoners were identified as Raja Raees, Shakeel and Sarfaraz. Three more death row prisoners were executed in Gujranawala. Death sentence prisoner Anayat Ullah was guilty of killing seven members of the same family in 2002 over a land dispute. Prisoners Zafar Iqbal and Latif were guilty of killing four persons, including a woman, in 1995. Two death row convicts, Ghulam Nabi and Allah Rakha were hanged in Lahore. Ghulam Nabi, resident of Sabzazar was guilty of killing a man in Muzand area of Lahore while Allah Rakha of Kassur had killed a man in Mustafabad area."

#### • 'Security fears for China-Pakistan corridor as Xi ends visit'

"Chinese President Xi Jinping said Tuesday a US\$46 billion economic corridor offered Pakistan a "historic development opportunity", but security fears linger over the project which involves major construction in some highly unstable areas. Pakistani and Chinese officials on Monday signed a series of more than 50 accords to inaugurate the China-Pakistan Economic Corridor, which will create a network of roads, railways and pipelines linking China's restive west to the Arabian Sea through Pakistan. The project is part of Beijing's "Belt and Road" plan to expand its trade and transport footprint across Central and South Asia. It will give China easier access to Middle Eastern oil via the deepwater port of Gwadar in southwest Pakistan."

#### • 'Pak and China launched a energy and infrastructure projects \$46 billion'

"China and Pakistan launched a plan on Monday 20, April, 2015 for energy and infrastructure projects in Pakistan worth \$46 billion, linking their economies and underscoring China's economic ambitions in Asia and beyond. China's President Xi Jinping arrived in Islamabad to oversee the signing of agreements aimed at establishing a China-Pakistan Economic Corridor between Gwadar port on the Arabian Sea and China's western Xinjiang region. The plan, which would eclipse US spending in Pakistan over the last decade or so, is part of China's aim to forge 'Silk Road' land and sea ties to markets in the Middle East and Europe. Xi, whose visit to Pakistan winds up on Tuesday 21, April, 2015, said it cemented an 'all-weather strategic cooperative partnership' between the neighbours. Prime Minister Nawaz Sharif said the corridor would transform Pakistan into a regional hub and give China a shorter and cheaper route for trade with much of Asia, the Middle East and Africa. "Friendship with China is the cornerstone of Pakistan's foreign policy," Nawaz said in a speech. Xi linked the economic cooperation with security. "Our cooperation in the security and economic fields reinforce each other, and they must be advanced simultaneously," he said. Nawaz added, "I assured President Xi that Pakistan considers China's security as important as its own security." Xi called for greater efforts to bring peace to Afghanistan, where Pakistan is keen to restrict the influence of its rival India."
