• 237 Iraq civilians killed in possible US airstrike in Mosul

A Kurdish news agency reporting directly from Mosul has reported that at least 237 people have been killed in airstrikes in the Mosul Al-Jadida neighbourhood of the war-ravaged city, most of them believed to be civilians. A correspondent working for the Iraqi Kurdish news site Rudaw in Mosul said that 130 of the people who were killed were huddled inside one residential building alone, while around 100 others were hit inside another. While the vast majority of those killed were civilians, some Daesh militants could be among the dead though it is currently unclear.

Trump administration hosts first anti-ISIL Meeting

US Secretary of State Rex Tillerson and Defense Secretary Jim Mattis are hosting Iraq's prime minister and diplomats from the coalition partners in a two-day meeting at the state department starting on Wednesday. Trump has vowed to make the fight against Islamic State in Iraq and the Levant (ISIL, also known as ISIS) a priority and directed the Pentagon and other agencies in January to submit a plan for defeating the group. ISIL has been losing ground in both Iraq and Syria, and three separate forces, backed by the United States, Turkey and Russia, are advancing on the group's Syrian stronghold of Raqqa.

Mosul: 'The worst is yet to come,' says UN as 400,000 trapped

An estimated 400,000 Iraqis are trapped in the Islamic State-controlled Old City of west Mosul facing food shortages and growing panic under shelling that could provoke a mass exodus, the United Nations refugee agency UNHCR said on Thursday. Many civilians fear fleeing because of IS snipers and landmines, but 157,000 have reached a reception and transit centre since the Iraqi government offensive on west Mosul began a month ago, it said.

Child victims of Mosul battle fill emergency hospital

The 9-year-old Iraqi boy was playing football on a patch of wasteground during a lull in the battle for Mosul when a mortar round fired by Islamic State militants landed nearby. It sprayed shrapnel into his lower legs and virtually severed them. Rushed by ambulance to this emergency field hospital 20 km (15 miles) east of the city, he was operated on overnight and both his feet were amputated. This mobile hospital has treated more than 1,000 patients, many of them women and children, since opening in early January.

However the list has been described as 'unusual and disturbing', as it has found risks among priority family groups seeking refuge, rather than individual males of a fighting age.

• How Regional Security Concerns Uniquely Constrain Governance in Northeastern Syria

In 2012, when Bashar al-Assad's regime withdrew most of its security forces from the Jazira in northeastern Syria, it ceded local power to the Kurdish Democratic Union Party (PYD) and its military wing. The PYD replicated past regime behavior, focusing on maintaining a secure hold of this strategic geographical area at the expense of effective governance. This approach has hindered the prospect of building a self-sustained administration. At the same time, outside actors such as Iraqi Kurdistan, Turkey, and the United States have inadvertently reinforced the PYD's security-focused rule while pursuing their own security concerns. Exploring potential avenues to peace and stable governance in Syria requires carefully identifying the interrelated nature of these various actors' security concerns in the Jazira.
