• Civilian deaths, Old City fight force Mosul battle rethink

Iraq Perched in bombed-out apartments overlooking west Mosul, Iraqi police snipers have in the last few days advanced to within a few hundred meters of the mosque where Islamic State leader Abu Bakr al—Baghdadi declared his caliphate nearly three years ago. Through holes knocked in walls, troops have a clear view of the al Nuri mosque's crooked, brown minaret and Islamic State's black flag on its white tip -- a hugely symbolic target in the battle to recapture Mosul now in its sixth month.

• ISIS in Africa: Implications from Syria and Iraq

At the end of 2016, Abu Bakr al-Baghdadi, leader of the Islamic State of Iraq and Syria (ISIS), announced that the group had "expanded and shifted some of our command, media, and wealth to Africa." ISIS's Dabiq magazine referred to the regions of Africa that were part of its "caliphate": "the region that includes Sudan, Chad, and Egypt has been named the caliphate province of Alkinaana; the region that includes Eritrea, Ethiopia, Somalia, Kenya, and Uganda as the province of Habasha; the North African region encompassing Libya, Tunisia, Morocco, Algeria, Nigeria, Niger, and Mauritania as Maghreb, the province of the caliphate." Leaving aside the mismatched ethno-linguistic groupings included in each of these "provinces," ISIS's interest in establishing a presence in Africa has long been a part of its vision for a global caliphate.

ISIS Tells Iraqis, 'Wake Up And Attack' US Soldiers In Iraq

The Islamic State group, also known as ISIS, has issued new threats to U.S. soldiers in Iraq, apparently infuriated by the lack of resistance they have faced from locals. The warnings came through encrypted social media application Telegram, where the jihadists and their supporters have established a number of channels capable of transmitting information without detection. The messages, which were quoted Thursday by data mining news site Vocativ came specifically in response to the U.S. military presence in the former ISIS stronghold of Ramadi. The central Iraqi city was one of many that were captured by the group in 2014, but it was retaken last year by Iraqi troops, Sunni Muslim tribal fighters and Shiite Muslim militias.

• Syrian Forces Liberate Areas in Suwayda from Deash Terrorists

• No fight against Militants possible while air strikes continue: Syrian Opposition

The Syrian opposition is "fed up" with banned militants but they cannot be stopped if Syria continues evicting populations of besieged areas, opposition negotiator Basma Kodmani said on Sunday.
