UNHCR provides legal assistance to displaced Iraqi families

The UN Refugee Agency, UNHCR, with its partners, has provided legal assistance to help more than 2,500 Iraqis displaced as a result of the Mosul offensive to receive new civil identity cards and other documents that were lost, damaged or destroyed as they fled their homes seeking safety. As many as 49 percent of displaced Iraqis interviewed by UNHCR protection partners were found to need help in getting new civil documentation. Many families lost documents or their papers were damaged as they fled conflict zones. Other families were told that birth and marriage documents, which had been issued when their areas were under the control of armed groups, were not legally recognised by the government of Iraq and needed replacement.

Albania to Send Troops to Fight ISIS in Iraq

Albania will send troops to Iraq to aid the global coalition against Islamic State, ISIS, the Defence Minister has told a parliamentary commission. IS female bomber arrested in eastern Mosul before attacking school

Iraqi forces arrested early Tuesday a girl believed to be an Islamic State member before carrying out a suicide bombing at a girls school in the security-controlled eastern Mosul. Sputnik News, quoting a local source, reported that the girl, putting on an explosive belt, was on her way to blow herself up inside a girls-only school in Wahda district. Police sealed off the school's vicinity, according to the source, who said that many IS-linked women had managed to melt within civilians though implicated in brutal abuses against Iraqi women over the past two years.

Irina Bokova said on Sunday that UNESCO wants to protect Iraqi artefacts from any future damage. According to Iraqi officials, they have retrieved looted artefacts which were found within tunnels in Mosul. The battle to liberate the city from Daesh is ongoing.

Trump is already losing the long-term fight in Iraq

Iraqi government forces last week launched a crucial campaign to retake the western side of Mosul, the Islamic State's largest remaining urban stronghold. U.S. planes and special forces were providing critical close-up support for a battle that commanders believe could drag on for months. Victory is not assured and the humanitarian cost, which Iraqi forces managed to minimize in capturing the eastern side of the city, could steeply rise. Yet the biggest challenge looms beyond the immediate battle: whether Mosul and other Sunni-populated areas of Iraq can be stabilized once the jihadists are driven out. Unfortunately, in his first weeks in office President Trump has significantly worsened the chances for success.

• Iraq Plans Offshore Oil, Gas Exploration To Boost Reserves

Iraq is planning to start offshore oil and gas exploration to boost its reserves, Oil Minister Jabar al-Luaibi said in a statement on Feb. 27.Luaibi said he "gave guidance to the Oil Exploration [Co.] about the importance of exploring territorial waters to assess the hydrocarbons reserves and to boost Iraq's capacity."During the week of Feb. 20, Iraq announced an increase in its oil reserves to 153 billion barrels (Bbbl) from a previous estimate of 143 Bbbl.

Mosul exodus: Thousands flee, over 750,000 Iraqi civilians trapped in anti-ISIS battle zone

As a US-backed offensive pushes into the western neighborhoods of Mosul, more than 2,000 people left the Iraqi city over the weekend. But with hundreds of thousands of civilians caught in the



fighting, camps near the city cannot house all the displaced. In what is believed to be the biggest exodus since local forces stepped up their operations to retake the western part of the city from Islamic State terrorist group (IS, formerly ISIS/ISIL) a week ago, the UN is now working to expand its camps near the city.
