Iraq to Comply With OPEC Cuts despite Lifting Oil Export Capacity

Despite efforts to ramp up its oil export capacity, OPEC's second-largest producer, Iraq, will comply with the production cuts pact, Iraq's Oil Minister Jabbar al-Luiebi said at a conference in London on Monday. In the OPEC/non-OPEC production restriction deal, Iraq agreed to cut 210,000 bpd off its October 2016 level and cap production at 4.351 million bpd.

In the space of a week, contrasting visions of a post-war Syria have been offered at two UN-backed summits – one in Sochi, hosted by Russia, the other in Vienna, the continuation of the Geneva talks. Whose diplomacy will triumph? Sochi, January 29-30, 2018 Main aims To assemble as wide a cross-section of those directly involved in the war as possible – 1,600 invitations were sent out. To present a roadmap for peace. To stay within the lines of UNSC Resolution 2254 from 2015 that calls for a "Syria-led" transition, and to reinvigorate the stalled Geneva talks.

Air Strikes Reportedly Kill More Than 30 in Syria's Idlib Province

Air strikes in Syria's rebel-held Idlib province have killed at least 33 people since Sunday, the Syrian Observatory for Human Rights and rescue workers in Idlib said on Monday. Most of the dead were in Saraqib, a town on the main highway linking to the government-held city of Aleppo and 20 km (12 miles) northwest of the Abu al-Duhur air base, which government forces and allied militias have captured from insurgents.

N-talks sought Iran's right to nuclear energy, not sanctions relief

The head of Iran's JCPOA follow-up committee said Mon. that the country's main objective in nuclear negotiations with 5+1 was to establish its right to nuclear energy, not to merely call for sanctions relief. Iranian deputy Foreign Minister for Political Affairs, Abbas Araghchi, who also heads the follow-up committee on JCPOA, made the remarks in a televised interview Monday night, adding "the sanctions relief was not our main concern, but one of our key demands during the negotiations. Our main concern for agreeing to sit down at the negotiating table was to establish Iran's right to peaceful nuclear energy."
