Labor income also changed little, up 4.3% (1.155 billion dinars against 1.107 billion in 2016). As a result, the current account deficit widened to -4,011 MTD (or -4.1% of GDP), against -3,037 MTD at the end of April 2016 (-3.4% of GDP).
